## Chaplain's Report...

We are frequently reminded that the Eucharist is the center of our life as Catholic Christians. This is also true of our Order, as demonstrated by the fact that we celebrate our most important occasions, e.g. our installation of officers and our memorial service by gathering for Mass; and Communion Breakfasts are frequently sponsored by our councils.

The presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is one of God's greatest gifts to us. The miracle of his presence in the consecrated bread and wine at Mass, to make the sacrifice of the Cross present to us and to nourish us with spiritual food is part of our Catholic faith.

To unbelievers, this is completely absurd. For us, it is a great treasure which we accept as part of the gift of faith we have received as Catholics.

But despite our strong faith in the Eucharist, there is always a danger that we will take this gift for granted either by staying away from Mass and Communion or by failing to honor Jesus present in the tabernacle in our churches.

At Sacred Heart, we have exposition of the Blessed Sacrament during the day on First Fridays, concluding with Benediction at 5:00 P.M. Some of us are available for prayer and adoration during those hours or for the Benediction service, but do we make an effort to be there? It would be a sacrifice to be there, but one that is well worthwhile.

A good resolution for those of us for whom it is not prohibited by our work schedule would be to sign up for an adoration slot during those First Friday expositions. We can also make an effort to visit our church or other churches at other times just to spend time in His presence in the Eucharist and to honor and thank him for this great gift.

May God continue to bless each of you and your families as we continue to enjoy the summer.

# Catechism

PRO  
FE  
RO

The Pope is the leader of the Catholic Church, the Bishop of Rome, a successor to St. Peter and the Vicar of Christ. He is infallible when he speaks on matters of Faith and Doctrine. He had full, supreme and universal power over the entire Catholic Church. We can not ignore what the Pope instructs us to do and still call ourselves Catholics. We should also make it a point to read the Encyclicals released by the Popes, especially the most current which deal with our world.

**882** The *Pope*, Bishop of Rome and Peter's successor, "is the perpetual and visible source and foundation of the unity both of the bishops and of the whole company of the faithful." "For the Roman Pontiff, by reason of his office as Vicar of Christ, and as pastor of the entire Church has full, supreme, and universal power over the whole Church, a power which he can always exercise unhindered."

**883** "The *college or body of bishops* has no authority unless united with the Roman Pontiff, Peter's successor, as its head." As such, this college has "supreme and full authority over the universal Church; but this power cannot be exercised without the agreement of the Roman Pontiff."

**890** The mission of the Magisterium is linked to the definitive nature of the covenant established by God with his people in Christ. It is this Magisterium's task to preserve God's people from deviations and defections and to guarantee them the objective possibility of professing the true faith without error. Thus, the pastoral duty of the Magisterium is aimed at seeing to it that the People of God abides in the truth that liberates. To fulfill this service, Christ endowed the Church's shepherds with the charism of infallibility in matters of faith and morals.
